
City celebrates Vietnam War service members

PETERSBURG Anyone driving down Washington Street in Petersburg on the afternoon of Friday, March 30, would have been struck by the unmistakable flurry of activity in the downtown corridor. On that day veterans, their families and friends, local and state dignitaries and others from the Tri-Cities and beyond gathered at the Freedom Support Center, 32 W. Washington St., to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War. The event was part of a commemorative partner program to thank and recognize veterans of the Vietnam era, including surviving spouses, personnel who were held as prisoners of war and those listed as missing in action, for their service and sacrifice.

In 2010, the Virginia General Assembly adopted a resolution recognizing March 30 as Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day, to celebrate the service and numerous contributions of the commonwealth's Vietnam era veterans and to coincide with the national observance.

Guest speaker for the Petersburg commemoration was retired Major Ruben Barkley Jr. During his remarks, Major Barkley commented on the significance of the welcome greeting bestowed upon them years after returning home from what, at the time, was considered an unpopular war. He talked about "the good, the bad, and the ugly" of his Vietnam tour of duty.

The presentation of the Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin with symbolic design detail intensified the ceremony's significance.
